



Draft Programme 2 Seas Mid-Term Review event

25-26 April 2019 – ICC GHENT

A. Purpose of the event

The Mid-Term Review event has as main focus the **showcasing of 2 Seas cross-border project achievements** that were delivered to date. All 68 approved projects are allocated a budget of ERDF in order to achieve their proposed outputs and results. Each of these results contributes directly to one of the Specific Objectives as set out for the 2 Seas Programme area in its Cooperation Programme.

Halfway through Programme implementation, it is therefore the ideal time to showcase what has been done so far and demonstrate how each of the approved projects corresponds to a territorial need and makes a difference on the ground. More advanced projects will present their good practices and how they overcome difficulties, while recently approved projects can learn from their peers and set out their ambitions for the next couple of years.

B. Why you should attend

The 2 Seas Mid-Term Review event will be the perfect occasion to see what the Programme has realised so far and how cross-border cooperation on very specific topics has concretely benefited the 2 Seas area.

The experience of the different approved 2 Seas projects will convince participants on the reasons why the delivered tools, products, pilots and models should be adopted and rolled-out in the different areas. This event will cover a wide range of topics that will be interesting for any public authority, research institute or private sector organisation that is willing to innovate and invest on methods and techniques that were proven successful. Peer-to-peer exchanges will be central and the networking moments will allow participants to learn from each other on both thematic expertise and project management.

This cross -border event will allow you to:

- understand how each of the 2 Seas projects directly contribute to the realisation of one of the Programme's objectives;
- find out about good practices in your theme of interest;
- meet a range of interesting projects and partner organisations from Belgium-Flanders, England, France and The Netherlands and create synergies;
- inspire newcomers and learn from more experienced organisations;
- access support from the 2 Seas Programme Team.

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C. Key components of the event

1. Project exhibition space

The project exhibition space will gather all 2 Seas approved projects and the Programme Authorities involved in the 2 Seas governance. They will invite you to their stand to showcase their cross-border achievements and talk to you about their 2 Seas experience.

2. Thematic workshops

Objective: to share the 2 Seas project achievements and invite more advanced projects to explain how they are making a difference on the ground. Each of the 6 thematic sessions will showcase multiple projects that are each working towards the delivery of one of the Programme Specific Objectives.

Expected results: a good insight on what the Programme has already delivered halfway through its implementation. It will allow the projects to share their achievements and raise visibility for their first results as well as to exchange with others.

Proposed format: each workshop will cover one important theme from the 2 Seas Cooperation Programme that was addressed by the 2 Seas approved projects. The workshop will take the form of a panel discussion with advanced projects which will be interviewed by a representative of the 2 Seas Programme governance. The audience will be invited to actively participate in the discussion throughout the session.

3. Technical workshops

Objective: to tackle specific topics that were highlighted in the questionnaire by Lead and project partners. Each session will be highly interactive and enable discussions between newcomers and more experienced partners.

Expected results: shared learnings and solutions to overcome the difficulties encountered throughout project implementation.

Proposed format: each workshop will cover one important topic that was highlighted by the Lead partners and project partners in their response to a broad questionnaire launched in February 2019. This questionnaire aimed at capturing the difficulties they still encounter during the project implementation. Each workshop will take the form of an interactive discussion among participants, facilitated by a member of the Joint Secretariat.

NOTE: all plenary sessions and workshops will be translated in the 3 Programme languages: English, French and Dutch.
