

A financial and political instrument of the EU Cohesion policy (ERDF) aimed at implementing joint actions and policy exchanges between national, regional and local actors from different Member States

# Overview of 2 Seas strategy 2014 – 2020

## Overall objective of the 2 Seas Programme 2014 – 2020:

To develop an innovative knowledge and research based, sustainable and inclusive 2 Seas area where natural resources are protected and the green economy is promoted



# Interreg 2 Seas in a nutshell



- Total Programme budget: 241 M € ERDF
- ERDF reimbursement rate: up to 60%
- Cooperation between at least 2 partners from 2 different Member States, with at least 1 UK partner
- No minimum or maximum duration for projects
- No minimum or maximum budget

# Examples of past 2 Seas cooperations




Setting-up of a cross-border fire brigade through the **MIRG-EU** project to rescue people from accidents occurring in the Channel or the North Sea




# Examples of past 2 Seas cooperations

The **MEMO** partnership worked on improved controls and eradication methods of invasive jellyfish-like species that were accidentally introduced to the 2 Seas area.

# Partnership requirements

- At least 2 partners:
  - minimum 2 Member States
  - at least 1 partner from the UK
- Any organisation can be eligible in the Programme apart from:
  - Organisations without legal personality
  - Consultancy firms with as primary objective the development and management of EU projects
- No maximum amount of partners



# Type of partners within a project

Two types of partners can be found within a 2 Seas project:


- **Project partner:**
  - financially contributing and getting ERDF,
  - actively involved in several project work packages.
- **Observer partner:**
  - having an interest in (a part of) the project,
  - that does not financially benefit from the project (no ERDF).

# What is a balanced partnership

Different ways of proposing a pertinent partnership, the key principles are:

1. **Thematical experience**: expertise in the theme!
2. **Geographical coverage**: wide geographical coverage
3. **Sectorial coverage**: Do I cover all necessary sectors and types of partners?

# 3. Project development process




# How to develop the project?

- Put all partners' experience on the table and map **ideas**
- Focus the **common issue/need** that the project wishes to tackle
- Identify the **potential solution** for this issue
- Define the **long term effect(s)/changes** that you are aiming to achieve

# Contribution to the Programme

- Demonstrate how your proposal contributes to the **Programme Specific Objectives**
- Check the **Programme output indicators** proposed for your SO and compare to the outputs you propose
- Check the **Programme result indicator** proposed for your SO and assure your project contributes to it

# Project intervention logic

- What do I want to change with my project idea?  
= **project result**
- How do I want to realise these changes?  
= **overall objective**, further broken down in **specific objectives**
- What are the concrete, tangible outputs I want to deliver and how will I achieve them  
= **outputs**
- Why are these outputs needed  
= **specific result**

# 4. Construction of draft budget



# How to construct a budget



At Concept note stage only estimated total project budget required!

## 1. Estimation at partner level:

- should reflect **involvement** in delivery of project outputs
- Should reflect the **duration** of the involvement
- should reflect **type of costs** required (big supplier costs, equipment, investment needed or not?)

## 2. At project level:

- Addition of partner budgets
- Main principle is value for money!

# Project idea



My organisation works in neighborhoods where it has been observed that a vast amount of material (furniture, electrical appliances, bicycles, etc.) is thrown away every day. The same issues have been identified by other organisations located in the 2 Seas area. All together, we would like to set up a crossborder project working on the reduction of waste implying a co-creation with the citizens.

# Project idea



In a previous project, we have started developing different activities related to the management of the 2 Seas coasts. With the five partners involved in the past project, we would like to continue working together in order to improve the preservation of this unique area, implying sustainable results.

# Intervention logic

Project expected result	More resource efficient marine economy in the 2 Seas area: waste prevention and increased recycling rate of 25% of shipping-related waste
Project Overall Objective	To reduce waste production and increase the collection and recycling of waste
Project Specific Objective	Enhance the capacity of ports to recycle collected-waste
Output	15 waste-collection and recycling facilities
Specific Result	Increase in waste collection and recycling by 5 % per participating port

# Intervention logic

Project expected result	The project develops a recovery centre to improve quality of life of vulnerable people
Project Overall Objective	Develop a recovery centre for vulnerable people
Project Specific Objective	3 pilot boats equipped to increase onboard security
Output	- 1 course for care services - 3 courses for vulnerable people to get better chances for employment
Specific Result	50 professionals and 200 beneficiaries are being coached

# Target group



Our project aims at developing app' for people suffering from diabetes. 6 partners (3 universities, 2 councils and 1 SME) are involved in the project. The project will be constructed as such:

2016	identification of the needs by the partners involved in the project
2017	development of the different app' by the technical partners
2018	test of the app' with the target group
