


1.1. ALMA (Aim-Learn-Master-Achieve): concept and content

Start up phase:

- Building up partnerships and defining the roles of actors within a Member State/region;
- Building transnational partnerships with the relevant actors in at least one receiving Member State.

Implementation phase:

- Selection of NEETs and their preparation for mobility;
- Mobility of young people;
- Follow-up with the young people after their stay abroad;
- Preparation of the Final Report;
- Dissemination of experience and the best practices.



1.2. National Competence centers for social innovation: buildingup and consolidating the capacity

The call aims:

at building up and consolidating the capacity of National competence centres for social innovation (NCCs). It builds on the lessons learnt and the developments triggered in most Member States by the previous Call, published in 2020 - Competence Centres for Social Innovation (VP/2020/010).

Projects will focus on:

- professionalisation and further development of NCCs
- creation of NCCs in the Member States where they have not been created yet

Who can apply?

Only consortia are eligible.

A consortium must include an applicant and at least two co-applicants. The members of the consortium shall represent at least 3 different Member States.

An endorsement is required to participate in this Call.

Deadline: 30/11/2023 at 5:00 PM CET time zone

Grant budget for the Call: 8 000 000 EUR

The form of grant: a lump sum grant

Expected duration of a project: up to 36 months

The size of grant: between 500 000 EUR and 1 500 000 EUR per project

Number of selected projects: 6-8. In optimal situation 27 Member States covered, with 3–5 countries covered by each project

Co-financing: at least 20%

1.3. Social Innovations for the Upskilling of Vulnerable Youth, Especially Young People not in Employment, Education, or Training (NEETs)

The general objective of this Call:

To foster scaling up of innovative approaches supporting in particular the 3rd objective of the European Year of Skills (*Matching people's aspirations, needs and skills-set, including the skills acquired during mobility, with labour market needs and opportunities, especially those offered by the green and digital transitions, emerging new sectors and core sectors in need <...>) and the headline indicator on NEETs of the European Pillar of Social Rights.*

Who can apply?

The Applicants (coordinator, beneficiary(ies) and associated partners) must be:

- legal entities (public or private bodies)
- established in one of the EU Member States.

1.3. Social Innovations for the Upskilling of Vulnerable Youth, Especially Young People not in Employment, Education, or Training (Skills call)

Tentative publication date: October/November 2023

Tentative deadline: February 2024

Grant budget for the Call: 9 000 000 EUR

The form of grant: a lump sum grant

Expected duration of a project: up to 24 months

The size of grant: between 200 000 EUR and 700 000 EUR per project

1.4. Mitigation of societal consequences of the war in Ukraine in the EU

Tentative publication date: end of 2023

Tentative deadline: March/April 2024

Grant budget for the Call: 22 000 000 EUR

Expected duration of a project: up to 18 months

The objectives of the Call: to promote socio-economic integration of the displaced people from Ukraine and to mitigate the societal consequences of the war in Ukraine in the EU Member States.

Who can apply: legal entities established and registered in the Member State are eligible as applicants or co- applicants and associated partners.
