Calls for proposals

Call 6 was launched last month. Applicants have to submit a Concept Note for their project before 2 May 2018. In a second step, an Application Form must be submitted between 8 August and 6 November 2018. The Monitoring Committee decision is expected for February 2019.


Those who submitted a Concept Note for **Call 5** have recently received a notification letter containing recommendations and/or requirements to take into account before proceeding to the next step of the application process. Full Application Forms for Call 5 need to be submitted before 2 May 2018.

Call 4 is currently open only to referred back projects having already submitted a first application form. Applicants have until 2 May 2018 to submit a revised Application Form. All documentation you need to apply for funding is available for download on our website.

New projects approved

Last month the Monitoring Committee approved 4 new projects. This brings the total number of Interreg 2 Seas projects to 44.

The **E2C** project will invest in research in transformation of electricity surpluses into chemicals and fuels. By making use of renewable electricity, E2C aims at lowering the carbon footprint.

Solarise will boost the adoption of solar energy by historical/public buildings and households (with focus on low-income families). As such, Solarise supports the EU to meet its target of 20% energy consumption from renewables by 2020.


Grassification will apply a multi-dimensional approach to roadside grass clippings refining in order to optimize it into a viable value chain for the bio-based and circular economy.

Horti-blueC will increase the adoption of new circular economy solutions in the 2 Seas area by upcycling agro-, agrofood and fisheries residues in horticulture.

Meet the project: CASCADE



CASCADE (or Community Areas of Sustainable Care and Dementia Excellent in Europe) is one of the seven social innovation projects. The project brings together ten partners from England, The Netherlands, France and Belgium.

Here's how Thomas Molloy and Anna Best from The Health and Europe Centre, the project's lead partner, describe CASCADE:

"Partners were aware of the challenges of a rapidly ageing population across the 2 Seas area, and hence the explosion in demand for elderly care, including dementia, services. We were aware of a fantastic model in the Netherlands that had not been trialled at scale, and believed it had the potential to fill the gap in terms of new financially sustainable approaches."

CASCADE will deliver a new, financially sustainable, holistic model of care for people living with dementia and the elderly in local communities. The project will also develop a centre of excellence to promote virtual consultation, learning, research and innovation. There will be 50 new beds for the elderly and people living with dementia, and a new learning package for all those having contact with them."


Project video contest
