2 Seas projects

The 2 Seas Programme currently counts 82 projects, all contributing to the innovative, sustainable and inclusive development of the 2 Seas area.

In this newsletter issue you can learn on how **SLIC** and **SOLARISE** contribute to the Interreg 2 Seas Specific Objective 2.1, which is to increase the adoption of low-carbon technologies in the 2 Seas area.

SLIC (visit project website)

- aims to increase the uptake of sustainable public lighting concepts and carbon reduction by public authorities.
- brings together 9 organisations and is led by Avans University of Applied Sciences.
- started on 01/01/2018 and will end on 01/06/2021
- has a budget of € 3 522 857 of which 60% ERDF.

SOLARISE (visit project website)

- facilitates the large-scale deployment of solar electricity/heat generation in the 2 Seas.
- brings together 12 organisations and is led by the University of Picardie Jules Verne.
- started on 01/10/2018 and will end on 30/06/2021
- has a budget of € 4 302 023 of which 60% ERDF.



The **SLIC** partners jointly develop methods, tools and concepts to help promote the use of low-carbon technologies for public lighting. SLIC foresees 7 pilot projects focusing on different low-carbon lighting techniques, including dimming, remote, sensors, dynamic optimisation and low voltage.

You can find a complete overview of the pilot projects in the <u>SLIC facts & figures sheet</u>. One of the pilots is currently being delivered in the historic heart of Bruges, where a sustainable solution is found for the beautiful historic lanterns.



New projects approved

On Thursday 30 and Friday 31 January, the Interreg 2 Seas Monitoring Committee approved four new cross-border projects. These decisions bring the total of selected projects for the current programming period to 82.

ENCORE or Energizing Coastal Regions with Offshore Renewable Energy is a Technological Innovation project that gathers 12 project partners and 26 observer partners. The project partners will jointly tap into the potential of the 2 Seas as a source of renewable energy.

The **MONUMENT** consortium consists of 12 partners and 24 observer partners. This Social Innovation project aims to strengthen the resilience and perseverance of informal carers of people living with dementia.



Also, two projects on Low-carbon Technologies have been selected. **MOBI-MIX** brings together cities, universities and companies to decarbonise road transport. The 11 partners will work together to facilitate the private sector to more effectively implement greener mobility solutions.

The final newcomer is **LECSEA**. The 10 partners of this project will work together on a successful take-off of Energy Communities in the 2 Seas region through 8 different demonstration pilots. In total, LECSEA should lead to a total of 3.750 tonnes of CO2 savings per year.

Seminars for approved projects

The seminar for approved project partners is a full day event that will clarify all you need to know as a recently approved project partner.

There will be detailed explanations about what needs to be done to successfully complete the Initiation stage, how to deliver your project and report upon its achievements, how to communicate on your project and the key principles to take into account regarding risk management and project evaluation.

The seminar is not project specific and the purpose is not to go into each of the projects in detail. The seminar is not mandatory but partners are strongly advised to attend.

All partners from the recently approved projects under the 8th call for proposals are invited to the seminar and can attend with a maximum of 2 people. The seminar is also open for new staff members from partner organisations in other Interreg 2 Seas projects, depending on availability. Please note priority will be given to partners from 8th call approved projects.

The Programme launched a beneficiary survey at the end of last year and received 133 responses! It has demonstrated an overall good level of satisfaction. Three points to keep in mind:

- 83% of respondents felt that the 2 Seas events organised in 2019 provided them with good information.

Interreg Volunteer Youth (IVY) is an initiative to support Interreg Programmes and Projects. Promoted by the European Commission's Directorate-General for Regional and Urban Policy and managed by the Association of European Border Regions (AEBR), IVY allows for the involvement of young people in European Territorial Cooperation projects.

Interreg Projects beneficiaries can host a volunteer to support, promote and report achievements of cooperation. An IVY volunteer will be part of your team, bring new ideas and help realise the project and advertise its results. Each experience is of a minimum of 2 to a maximum of 6 months.
